Basic Directions:

This challenging word game can be completed by individuals or by students working in pairs. Distribute the printable on the next page and have students cut out the letters at the bottom. Ask them to move the letters around to form the words that fit each clue. If you use this as a partner activity, assign partners in advance and give one worksheet to each pair. Have students take turns making and recording words as they discuss the riddles. The answers can be completed in any order. Allow students to use other sources such as dictionaries, encyclopedias, and internet searches to find the answers to the word riddles, but remind them that




