

Character Bio Reports

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Having students write Character Bio Reports is an easy and effective method of teaching them how to write an original report on a famous person or character. Instead of copying facts and rewording them to write a report, students must research the person's accomplishments and use that information to write a short character analysis. Throughout this process, students deepen their understanding of character traits. This assignment is so flexible that it can be used several times during the year by focusing on different characters. In this teaching packet, you'll find a basic Character Bio Report assignment along with six different variations of this activity. This product also includes an editable PowerPoint file with the basic assignment directions and an editable version of the grading rubric.

Common Core English Language Arts Standards
The Character Bio Reports activity addresses Common Core ELA Standards for grades 3 through 6. Conducting the research aspect of the assignment meets several of the Informational Text standards for those grade levels. Writing the report addresses multiple writing standards, especially anchor standards 2 and 7, which state respectively, "Write informative/explanatory texts to examine a topic and convey ideas and information clearly," and "Conduct short research projects that build knowledge about a topic." See pages 20 and 21 for a complete list of the standards met by this activity.

Tips for Getting Started
The Character Bio Report lesson will require several days to a week to complete depending on how much class time you devote to the project. This packet contains a variety of direction pages and graphic organizers, but it's not necessary to print them all. The only handout that your students must have is a copy of the directions that you select for this particular assignment. All other materials can be displayed on a projector or recreated with a foldable or homemade graphic organizer. Start by reading the lesson suggestions on the next page which will help you plan this research and writing activity.

Customizing the Directions and Rubric
To create your own custom directions and/or rubric for scoring the reports, open and edit the PowerPoint file located in the product zip file. The font used in both documents is Century Gothic, but you can change it if you prefer a different font or don't have that one installed.

Character Bio Reports Lesson Suggestions

- Introducing the Lesson**
Choose the focus of your assignment. You can use the basic Character Bio directions and leave it completely open-ended, or you can use one of the direction pages at the end of this packet. Write your assignment deadline on the line at the bottom of the page, and print a copy for each student. If you plan to use the Character Bio Rubric to score their reports, display a copy of the rubric and explain it to your students.
- Brainstorming Topics and Selecting a Character**
After you present the assignment, provide class time to brainstorm characters for their writing topic. Then ask students to fill out a Topic Approval slip with the name of the character they want to research and submit it to you for approval.
- Researching**
Give students a copy of the Research Notes page, or have them take notes on their own paper. Remind them to record their sources if you plan to have them report their sources later. If possible, arrange for them to have class time or computer time for research.
- Choosing Character Traits**
Display the Character Traits list and discuss the meanings of unfamiliar words. Ask your students to select three character traits that best describe their person. Ask them to list details from their research notes to support their chosen character traits. In some cases they may need to conduct a little more research to find additional supporting details. (Note: During the lesson, you might realize that your students need more work with character traits. If so, you may want to use the lessons in **Analyzing Character Traits** before continuing the Character Bio Reports lesson.)
- Organizing Ideas**
Teach your students how to organize their ideas before writing their reports. Choose the graphic organizer or foldable that you feel is most appropriate for the lesson and introduce it to your students. They should write one character trait at the top of each section or on the foldable flaps and list supporting details underneath.
- Writing the Report**
When students are ready to write, introduce them to the 5-paragraph essay format shown on the Character Bio Rocket. Explain the kinds of information and details they need to include in each part of their report. After they write their rough drafts, display the Character Bio Rocket again and ask them to review their papers to see if they have included all necessary information. If desired, provide time for writing conferences as well as time to write the final drafts. A lined-paper template with a border is provided, but you may prefer to have your students type their reports or write them on their own paper.
- Assessing and/or Grading the Report**
If you'd like to use the scoring rubric on page 11, assess each aspect of the paper by assigning it a value from 1 (low) to 5 (high). Total the points and use the scale under the rubric to assign a letter grade. You can customize this rubric using the editable PowerPoint file provided.

What character traits are demonstrated by people who excel in their professions and achieve greatness? To find out, you'll research one person, past or present, whom you admire. You'll discover facts about his or her life experiences and accomplishments, and you'll use this information to write a short report organized according to that person's character traits. Follow the steps below to write a report that rocks!



Step 1: Select a Topic

Brainstorm a list of people you admire. They may be living now or have lived long ago. Consider presidents, inventors, civil rights leaders, teachers, writers, or community members. Then choose one person as the focus of your paper.

Step 2: Research Character

Research your character using a wide variety of resources. If the person is someone you know, try to arrange an interview. Continue your research until you have listed at least 8 to 10 accomplishments or important life experiences that demonstrate that person's character.

Step 3: Select Character Traits

Think about the person's accomplishments and important life experiences. What traits describe this person? Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that are supported by your research.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

Organize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits, and under each one record the details that support your selections.

Step 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information from your research. Start with an introduction that gives brief biographical information. The body should include at least three paragraphs, one paragraph per character trait. Conclude with a paragraph that explains why you selected this person or offers some reflection on the person's accomplishments and impact on society. Revise your first draft and write your final copy.

President Bio Report

For this assignment, you'll be researching one president and writing a short report. First, you'll choose a President, past or present, whom you admire. Then you'll research facts about his or her life experiences and accomplishments. Then you'll use what you learned to write a short report organized according to that person's character traits. Follow the steps below to write a report that rocks!



Step 1: Select a President

Brainstorm a list of Presidents you admire. They may be living now or have lived long ago. You may have to do a little research before you can make your selection. Then choose one President as the focus of your paper.

Step 2: Research President

Research this President using a variety of resources. Continue your research until you have listed at least 8 to 10 accomplishments or important life experiences that demonstrate that person's character. You'll also need to record basic background information about that President.

Step 3: Select Character Traits

Think about the President's accomplishments and important life experiences. What traits describe this person? Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that are supported by your research.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

Organize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits, and under each one record the details that support your selections.

Step 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information from your research. Start with an introduction followed by at least one paragraph on each of the three character traits you selected. Show that the President you selected demonstrates each character trait. Conclude with a paragraph that explains why you selected this President or a reflection on his or her accomplishments. Revise your first draft and write your final copy.

Scientist/Inventor Bio Report

Over the past centuries, scientists and inventors have been responsible for huge changes in our society. Their accomplishments, discoveries, and inventions have revolutionized the way we communicate, live, travel, and store information. What character traits are demonstrated by people whose lives have such tremendous impact? To find out, you'll research one scientist or inventor, past or present, whom you admire. You'll discover facts about his or her life experiences and accomplishments, and you'll use this information to write a short report organized according to that person's character traits. Follow the steps below to write a report that rocks!



Step 1: Select a Topic

Brainstorm a list of scientists or inventors, past or present, that you admire. You may want to think of an invention or discovery important to you and write about the inventor or scientist responsible for that discovery.

Step 2: Research Scientist or Inventor

Research your scientist or inventor using a wide variety of resources. You'll need a few basic facts about the invention or discovery, but you should focus your research on the person behind the discovery. If the person is someone you know, try to arrange an interview. Continue your research until you list at least 8 to 10 accomplishments or important life experiences that demonstrate that person's character.

Step 3: Select Character Traits

Think about the person's accomplishments and important life experiences. What traits describe this person? Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that are supported by your research.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

Organize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits, and under each one record the details that support your selections.

Step 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information from your research. Start with an introduction that includes background details about the invention or discovery. The body of your paper should include at least three paragraphs, one paragraph for each character trait. Conclude with a paragraph that explains why you chose this scientist or a reflection on the person's accomplishments. Revise your first draft and write your final copy.

Historical Figure Bio Report

What character traits were demonstrated by people who achieved greatness in the past? To find out, you'll research one historical figure whom you admire. You'll discover facts about his or her life experiences and accomplishments, and you'll use this information to write a short report organized according to that person's character traits. Follow the steps below to write a report that rocks!



Step 1: Select a Topic

Brainstorm a list of historical figures that you admire. You may need to do some research before you are able to make your selection. Then choose one person to use as the focus of your paper.

Step 2: Research Historical Figure

Research your historical figure using a wide variety of resources. Continue your research until you have listed at least 8 to 10 accomplishments or important life experiences that demonstrate that person's character.

Step 3: Select Character Traits

Think about the person's accomplishments and important life experiences. What traits describe this person? Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that are supported by your research.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

Organize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits, and under each one record the details that support your selections.

Step 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information from your research. Start with an introduction that includes background information about the major contributions of this historical figure. The body of your paper should include at least three paragraphs, one paragraph per character trait. African American Bio Report

For this assignment, you'll write a report about an African American (past or present) who is recognized for his or her accomplishments and contributions. You'll choose a person whom you admire and who had a positive impact on others. Next, you'll conduct research to discover facts about the person's life experiences and accomplishments, and you'll use this information to write a short report organized according to that person's character traits. Follow the steps below to write a report that rocks!

Step 1: Select an African American

Brainstorm a list of African Americans you admire. They may be living now or have lived long ago. You may have to do a little research before you can make your selection. Then choose one person who will be the focus of your paper.

Step 2: Research and Record Facts

Research this person using a variety of resources. Begin by recording background facts and information about your person. Continue your research until you have listed at least 8 to 10 of the person's accomplishments or important life experiences.

Step 3: Select Character Traits

Think about the person's accomplishments and important life experiences. What traits describe this person? Select **three** traits that are supported by your research.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

Organize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits on a 3-part graphic organizer, and under each trait record the details that support your selections.

Step 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information from your research. Start with an introduction followed by at least three paragraphs, one paragraph per character trait. Conclude with a brief paragraph that offers a personal connection or a reflection on that person's accomplishments and/or impact on others' lives. Revise your first draft and write your final copy.

Native Country Character Bio Reports

Research an important person from your native country. The person may be still living or someone from the past. How has this person positively impacted your country or the country where he or she now lives? What character traits describe this individual? To find out, you'll be researching this person and writing a short report in the form of a character analysis. First, you'll research facts about his or her life experiences and accomplishments. Then you'll use this information to write a short report organized according to his or her character traits. Follow the steps below to write a report that rocks!

Step 1: Select a Famous Person

Brainstorm a list of important people from your country. You may need to do some research before you are able to make your selection. Then choose one person to use as the focus of your paper.

Step 2: Research Historical Figure

Research this person using a wide variety of resources. Continue your research until you have listed at least 8 to 10 accomplishments or important life experiences that demonstrate that person's character.

Step 3: Select Character Traits

Think about the person's accomplishments and important life experiences. What traits describe this person? Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that are supported by your research.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

Organize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits, and under each one record the details that support your selections.

Step 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information from your research. Start with an introduction that includes background information about the major contributions of this person. Book Character Bio Report

Think of a book character whom you admire or with whom you can identify. What traits does this character demonstrate? To find out, you'll gather details about that character's words and actions, and you'll use this information to write a short report organized according to that character's traits. Follow the steps below to write a report that rocks!

Step 1: Select a Topic

Brainstorm a list of book characters you admire. Start by thinking of your favorite books and the important characters in those books. Then choose one character as the focus of your paper.

Step 2: Identify Character Traits

Based on your reading, what character traits describe this person? Refer to the Character Traits list and select three traits that you'll be able to justify with evidence from the text.

Step 3: Find Supporting Details

Find a copy of the book where you were first introduced to this character. Scan the text to find clues about the character's traits. Look for the character's actions, his or her words, and the descriptions given by the author. Continue scanning and recording ideas until you have listed at least 8 to 10 details that demonstrate that person's character.

Step 4: Organize Ideas

Organize your ideas before writing. Write your three character traits, and under each one record the details that support your selections.

Step 5: Write the Report

Write an essay using the information you gathered. Start with an introduction in which you identify the book's title and author as well as the character you have chosen to analyze. Include a one-sentence summary of the book's plot. In the body of your paper, write at least three more paragraphs, one paragraph about each trait. Conclude with a brief paragraph explaining why you chose to write about this person and what you can learn from the character. Revise your first draft and write your final copy.

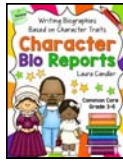

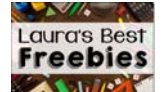
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
